Dennis,

Asst. DPW Director Greg Boggs has been investigating the use of composite manhole casting and lids to be used in gravel roads. Right now, we use standard steel castings and lids. Over time, chloride used to control dust corrodes the steel making it very difficult to open the manholes in emergencies. The composite castings do not corrode and will be much easier to open.

We would like to purchase forty of these castings from Michigan Pipe and Valve for \$27,808.00. They were the lowest of three quotes obtained. Additionally, because they are made of composite material, we would like to purchase steel plates for \$2,359 which fasten to the lids so we can locate the manholes via metal detector. The steel plates will not affect the performance of the castings and lids. Please see Greg's memo attached herein for more information.

This is a planned expense in the sewer fund for 2021 from account 592-550-970.000.

MEMORANDUM

RE: ***EJ Composite Sanitary Sewer Frames and Covers***

Jeff,

During our Manhole Assessment Certification Program (MACP) that we did with the SAW grant over the last few years, we had difficulty accessing our sanitary manholes that are in the roadway in gravel roads. These manholes are left below grade, due to the type of maintenance that is needed to maintain a gravel road.

These accessibility issues aren't just because the manholes are left below grade. The industry standard for manholes are either cast iron or ductile iron. Part of the maintenance to gravel roads is dust control, which is applied via a chloride solution. Chloride is very corrosive and it eventually leeches down to our sanitary structures, either by moisture or road grading, causing heaving corrosion on our manhole covers, making them very difficult to open. In a sewer emergency, it takes extra time and manpower to expose these manholes that are buried, and spending extra time on trying to gaining access to corroded manholes could mean more damage to our residents and business owners properties.

A solution to the corrosion issues with the manhole frames and covers in gravel roads is to replace them with frames and covers made out of a composite material, that is designed to be resistant to corrosion, without losing the strength of cast iron. These new frame and covers that are made by EJ (East Jordan Iron Works), will make these structures better accessible for our Technicians, whether if it is for routine maintenance or emergencies. I also looked into custom steel plates from our local steel supplier. The plates will be laid over the composite manhole covers, so our Technicians will be able to locate the manholes with their magnetic locators. These plates will also help protect the composite covers from our excavator, when our Technician's need to unburied

We have identified 40 manhole structures in gravel roads that will need to be converted, so I reached out to 3 of our waterworks suppliers for pricing on these EJ composite frames and covers, Ferguson Waterworks, Michigan Pipe and Valve, and Core and Main. Michigan Pipe and Valve was the cheapest vendor for the Frames at \$27,808.00. Ferguson Waterworks pricing was \$28,374.00, and Core and Main was \$29,270.00. For the steel plates, I reached out to the local steel supplier, Hill Steel for pricing on custom 3/16" thick, 24" round steel plates. The cost of these plates is \$2,051.85 and is based on current market steel pricing.



I recommend we purchase 40 EJ Composite Sanitary Manhole Frames and Covers from Michigan Pipe and Valve, and 40 round 24" steel plates from Hill Steel for the amount not exceed \$30,167.62.

I added 15% to the cost of the steel plates, due to the volatile steel market.

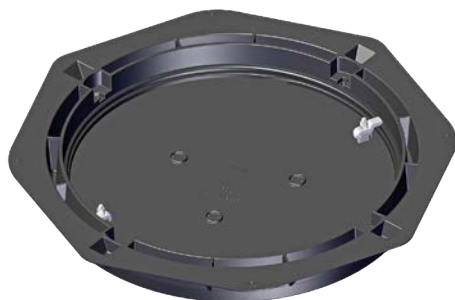

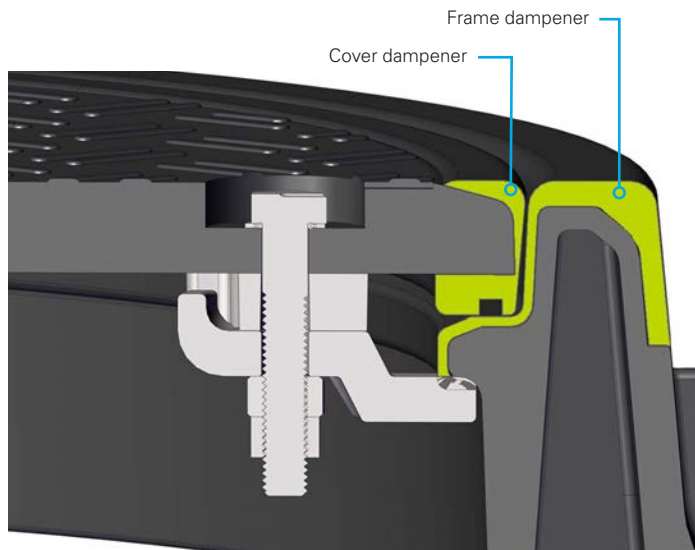


Illustrating the standard 30" clear opening frame and cover, which includes two quarter turn paddle locks and one pick bar.

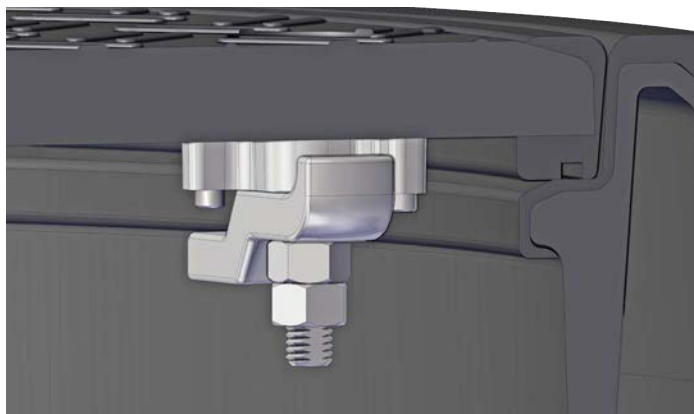
Illustrating a cutaway highlighting the cover and frame dampeners.



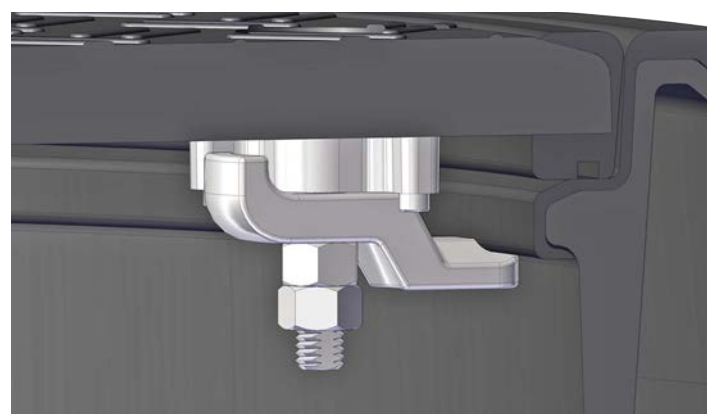
Cutaway showing the cover dampener around the outer edge (far right).

- Code Enforcement is responsible for enforcing the general ordinances of the Township such as junk, trash and debris, vehicles, weeds, etc. Zoning Ordinance issues such as signs, illegal structures and certain activities also fall under the purview of Code Enforcement.
- Our Code Enforcement services are typically provided Monday thru Friday. However, enforcement services are also provided on weekends and holidays as needed.

- In 2017, The Township increased its Code Enforcement Staff from one, part time Inspector to one full time clerk/inspector and one part time inspector.

Complaints

- The Township has adopted a policy requiring all complaints to be in writing for the Township to investigate.
- Residents can make complaints by:
 - Using the Public Service Request System on our website.
 - Download or pickup the Complaint Referral form and return in person or via e-mail to the Township.
 - Call our Offices and speak to a Staff Member
- Every complaint is investigated and resolved no matter the required resources to do so.

Investigations

- The Township tries to resolve every case quickly, through cooperation from the homeowner, using open communication and providing information about ordinances.
- Many times residents have no idea they are violating any kind of rule.
- Once a complaint has been received, the Township sends the property owner a letter informing them of the violation and informs them that they have 10 business days to resolve the issue.
 - In certain circumstances the Township will work with property owners to set a reasonable time frame for violations to be resolved if the work will take longer than ten days.
- If the property owner does not take care of the violation, The Township may issue the property owner a court appearance ticket. Once a ticket is issued a judge will determine if an order will be issued to correct the problem.

Grass and Weeds

- Township parcels must keep their grass and weeds under control at all times.
- Once grass and weeds exceed 8”, enforcement activities can commence if reported or found by Inspectors.
- These complaints are given 10 days to comply with grass cutting regulations.
- The Township will mow properties through our contractor (ACE Outdoor Services) after the 10 day period and within 24-48 hours of being requested.
- The Township charges the property owners \$165.00 per mowing which covers the actual service and administrative fees.
- If these fees are not paid, they can be placed on property taxes for collection.

- Only 14 cases required settlement in the court system.

Enforcement Activity

- Ordinance Enforcement Officers are mainly reactive to complaints.
- They do proactively patrol the Township for snipe sign violations removing signs whenever possible.
- While they are out an about, they do record obvious violations such as junk and debris issues or grass and weed violations.
 - Officers do not drive around specifically looking for these violations.
- Why are we not more proactive?
 - Ordinance Officers perform all their own clerical work such as tracking, data entry, sending letters, scheduling follow-up, answering phones, and returning voicemail and email messages.
 - Although the Township has invested more into Ordinance Enforcement in the past few years, budgetary constraints still exist and staffing shortages require split times in the office and in the field.
- Ordinance Officers do work weekends, on occasion, to patrol for illegal sign use.

Police and Ordinance Enforcement

The Police Department assists in Ordinance Enforcement when they are requested to by Township Staff or when a complaint is directly received through Dispatchers. Some of their most common calls for service are:

- Illegally parked boats/RV's
- Excessive Junk and Debris
- Unlicensed Vehicles
- Noise Complaints (Late night party's, barking dogs)
- In 2020, they received 51 code enforcement calls and 12 so far in 2021.

Dear Mr. Linihan:

Based on our discussions, we have provided the following proposal to assist with the evaluation and design of the pedestrian bridge at Creasey Bicentennial Park. Our services for this project will utilize the as-needed engineering contract coordinated through the township department of public works.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

In July 2020, ROWE completed a structure evaluation resulting in a recent recommendation to close this structure based on some failing wood members. The township would like to replace this structure as soon as possible to re-open access to walking paths within the park.

A study phase will evaluate options for a culvert, wood structure with concrete abutment, composite/fiberglass or hybrid wood structure with recycled composite decking. The study will identify construction cost along with long-term maintenance factors.

It should be noted that the permit review process for Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) has currently taken up to 90 days minimum for approval. The watercourse is named as the Shermin Drain and downstream as the Carman Creek and will require review by Genesee County Drain Commissioner.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Site Investigations

ROWE will visit the site with township staff and discuss proposed boardwalk details. Soil borings will not be completed. A topographic survey will be completed from the edge of the woods for construction access and cross sections will be completed as needed for a HY-8 hydraulic model for permitting.

Preliminary Design

Modeling to size a culvert option will be completed. Construction cost opinions for each concept will be provided. ROWE will schedule a meeting to review options and construction cost opinion information with the township. Upon approval of the selected option, ROWE will prepare a 60 percent plan set, details, an EGLE joint permit application, soil erosion and sedimentation control (SESC) permit, and building permit application for execution by the Contractor. Permit fees are not included in ROWE fees and will be paid directly by the township or as a direct reimbursement as additional services.

Final Design

Comments from the preliminary design phase will be addressed in a 90 percent construction document set. We will prepare a bidding documents which will include technical specifications. An updated construction cost opinion will be developed. ROWE will submit the 90 percent set of documents to the township for review.

Lady and gentleman of the board. Before you today is a request for the approval of motion to proceed with engineering associated with the design and construction management of the replacement of the pedestrian bridge over the Sherwood Drain at Bicentennial Park.

Earlier this spring during an inspection of the bridge by ROWE PCS it was determined that structural issues were present and the bridge should be closed. This bridge is part of the hiking trails on the west side of the park and the closure greatly limits its access. ROWE PCS will do a survey and site investigation, preliminary design with cost estimates and a final design. Depending on if the work needs to be completed by a contractor ROWE PCS will assist in bid letting and construction assistance. The pricing assumes the additional work. If we are able to complete installation the price will be significantly less.

RECCOMENDED MOTION:

Rollover Accident / OWI

Officers were dispatched to I-75NB at Holly Road for a truck that had rolled over. Upon arrival the driver was found to have been ejected from the vehicle and was slow to respond. Initially he told officers there was a female passenger in the truck with him and one could not be located. After a search of the area including using a K-9, thermal camera, & a drone with a thermal camera no other occupants could be found. The suspect was taken to Genesys where it was confirmed by his parents that he was the lone occupant of the vehicle and his injuries consisted of a broken neck / back. Alcohol is believed to be a factor.

Motorist Assist / CCW

Officers noticed a broke down motorcycle and pulled over to provide assistance. The driver of the motorcycle was found to have no MC endorsement on his driver's license. The driver was arrested and after a search incident to arrest, an unregistered handgun was located. The driver was also a convicted felon and not supposed to be in possession of any firearms. After processing at the GBTPD the arrest was lodged at the Genesee County Jail.

Hit and Run Accident

An officer responded to an unknown accident. The officer located a single vehicle disabled in the roadway. The driver of the vehicle advised that the at-fault vehicle left the scene. The driver on scene had a warrant and was arrested however, the jail would not lodge and he was released. Officers later received information that the at-fault vehicle was seen at 6309 Woodsdale Drive. Officers made contact with the residents and further investigation determined that one of them was the driver of the at-fault vehicle. They admitted to the offense and was cited and released.

Vehicle Chase / Fleeing and Eluding / Resisting and Obstructing

An officer attempted to stop a vehicle however, was led on a brief chase before finally coming to a stop. Once the vehicle stopped, the passenger ran from the traffic stop. The driver of the vehicle, a 16-year-old male, was placed under arrest for fleeing and eluding and violation of his GDL. The passenger was later apprehended in the 5300 block of Mocer Ln and resisted officers upon contact. The juvenile driver was arrested, mugged, and turned over to a parent. The passenger was arrested for resisting and obstructing and lodged at the Genesee County Jail.

Rather than stop, the vehicle continued driving at a high rate of speed as it entered I75 and travelled to I475 before exiting onto E. Hill Rd. The officer stopped the vehicle as it attempted to re-enter I475. The driver and found to be OWI (.19) and was arrested, processed, and after a datamaster he was lodged at the Genesee County Jail.
