**Ordinance 26-10**  
**An Ordinance to Amend City Code**  
**Chapter 66-3 “Prohibited Acts”**  
**Effective: April 7, 2026**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW CARROLLTON, MARYLAND, AUTHORIZING AND REGULATING THE USE OF PORTABLE TOILETS DURING CONSTRUCTION AND RECONSTRUCTION IN THE CITY BY ADDING NEW § 66-3(U) TO THE CODE.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of New Carrollton is an incorporated municipality governed pursuant to Article XI-E of the Constitution of Maryland; and

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland provides that the Mayor and Council of the City of New Carrollton have the authority to pass such ordinances as it deems necessary to preserve peace and good order, and to protect the health, comfort and convenience of the residents of the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of New Carrollton seeks to ensure that construction and reconstruction activities conducted within the City are performed in a manner that protects public health, safety, and welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, temporary access to sanitary facilities is necessary for workers engaged in construction, demolition, renovation, or reconstruction activities; and

**WHEREAS**, the City desires to establish clear standards and permitting requirements governing the placement, maintenance, and duration of portable toilets to prevent nuisance conditions and ensure compliance with public health and safety regulations;

Section 1. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF NEW CARROLLTON, THAT § 66-3, “PROHIBITED ACTS” of CHAPTER 66,” HEALTH AND SANITATION,” IS HEREBY AMENDED TO ADD NEW § 66-3(U) as follows:

**§ 66-3. Prohibited acts.**

A. through T. \*\*\*\*NO CHANGES\*\*\*\*

U. IT SHALL BE LAWFUL TO PERMIT THE TEMPORARY PLACEMENT AND USE OF PORTABLE TOILETS DURING AUTHORIZED CONSTRUCTION OR RECONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES, SUBJECT TO A CITY-ISSUED PERMIT AND COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE HEALTH, SAFETY, LOCATION AND MAINTENANCE STANDARDS.

**(1) DEFINITIONS.** AS USED IN THIS SUBSECTION, THE FOLLOWING TERMS SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED:

**PORTABLE TOILET.**

A TEMPORARY, SELF-CONTAINED SANITATION FACILITY DESIGNED FOR SHORT-TERM USE AND NOT PERMANENTLY CONNECTED TO A WATER SUPPLY OR SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM.

**CONSTRUCTION OR RECONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY.**

ANY PERMITTED CONSTRUCTION, DEMOLITION, RENOVATION, REHABILITATION OR RECONSTRUCTION OF A STRUCTURE OR SITE, INCLUDING ASSOCIATED SITE WORK.

**PERMIT.**

A WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION ISSUED BY THE CITY OF NEW CARROLLTON ALLOWING THE PLACEMENT AND USE OF A PORTABLE TOILET IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION.

**(2) AUTHORIZATION.** PORTABLE TOILETS SHALL BE PERMITTED ONLY AS A TEMPORARY ACCESSORY USE DURING APPROVED CONSTRUCTION OR RECONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES AND ONLY WITH A VALID PERMIT ISSUED BY THE CITY.

**(3) PERMIT REQUIREMENTS.**

(A) PERMIT REQUIRED. NO PERSON SHALL PLACE OR USE A PORTABLE TOILET WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS DURING CONSTRUCTION OR RECONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING A PERMIT FROM THE CITY.

(B) APPLICATION.

THE PERMIT APPLICATION SHALL INCLUDE, AT MINIMUM:

- (I) ADDRESS AND PARCEL NUMBER OF THE CONSTRUCTION SITE.
- (II) DESCRIPTION AND EXPECTED DURATION OF THE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY.
- (III) NUMBER AND TYPE OF PORTABLE TOILETS PROPOSED.
- (IV) PROPOSED PLACEMENT LOCATION OR LOCATIONS ON THE SITE OR WITHIN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY, IF APPLICABLE.
- (V) NAME AND CONTACT INFORMATION OF THE PORTABLE TOILET SERVICE PROVIDER.
- (VI) ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE CITY, COUNTY AND STATE HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS.

(4) **PERMIT TERM.** PERMITS SHALL BE ISSUED OR RENEWED MONTHLY FOR THE DURATION OF THE ACTIVE CONSTRUCTION OR RECONSTRUCTION PERMIT UNLESS REVOKED EARLIER BY THE CITY.

(5) LOCATION AND PLACEMENT STANDARDS.

(A) SITE PLACEMENT. PORTABLE TOILETS SHALL:

- (i) BE PLACED ON THE CONSTRUCTION SITE WHENEVER FEASIBLE.
- (ii) NOT OBSTRUCT SIDEWALKS, TRAVEL LANES, FIRE HYDRANTS, UTILITIES OR EMERGENCY ACCESS.
- (iii) NOT ENCROACH INTO THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY WITHOUT SEPARATE CITY APPROVAL.

(B) SCREENING. WHERE VISIBLE FROM A PUBLIC STREET OR ADJACENT RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY, THE CITY MAY REQUIRE REASONABLE SCREENING TO REDUCE VISUAL IMPACT.

(6) **MAINTENANCE AND HEALTH STANDARDS.**

(A) SANITATION. PORTABLE TOILETS SHALL:

- (i) BE MAINTAINED IN A CLEAN, SANITARY AND OPERABLE CONDITION.
- (ii) BE REGULARLY SERVICED BY A LICENSED AND AUTHORIZED SCAVENGER TO PREVENT ODOR, OVERFLOW OR UNSANITARY CONDITIONS.
- (iii) COMPLY WITH ALL APPLICABLE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS.

(B) RESPONSIBILITY. THE PROPERTY OWNER, CONTRACTOR AND PERMIT HOLDER SHALL BE JOINTLY RESPONSIBLE FOR COMPLIANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION AND ALL PERMIT CONDITIONS.

**(7) PROHIBITIONS.**

(A) PORTABLE TOILETS:

- (i) SHALL NOT BE USED AS A PERMANENT OR LONG-TERM SANITATION FACILITY.
- (ii) SHALL NOT BE OCCUPIED OUTSIDE OF ACTIVE CONSTRUCTION OR WORK HOURS UNLESS EXPRESSLY AUTHORIZED BY THE CITY.
- (iii) SHALL BE REMOVED PROMPTLY UPON COMPLETION OR CESSATION OF CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY.

**(8) ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES.**

(A) **ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY.** THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE ENFORCED BY THE CITY'S CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS OR OTHER AUTHORIZED CITY OFFICIALS.

(B) **VIOLATIONS.** FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS SUBSECTION OR ANY PERMIT CONDITION MAY RESULT IN:

- (i) REVOCATION OF THE PORTABLE TOILET PERMIT.
- (ii) ISSUANCE OF MUNICIPAL CITATIONS.
- (iii) FINES PURSUANT TO § 66-5 AND § 1-21A OF THE CITY CODE.
- (iv) REMOVAL OF THE PORTABLE TOILET AT THE OWNER'S EXPENSE IF CONDITIONS POSE A PUBLIC HEALTH OR SAFETY RISK.

**(9) SEVERABILITY.** IF ANY SUBSECTION, SENTENCE, CLAUSE, OR PROVISION OF THIS SECTION IS HELD INVALID, SUCH INVALIDITY SHALL NOT AFFECT THE VALIDITY OF THE REMAINING PROVISIONS.

**Section 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED AND ORDAINED,** by the City Council of the City of New Carrollton, Maryland, this ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) calendar days after its passage.

## Background

The City of New Carrollton is a diverse community that values all of its residents. To expand the eligibility qualifications and registration guidelines for both U.S. citizen and noncitizen residents, on December 18, 2024, the City Council passed Charter Amendment Resolution 25-08, "Qualifications and Registration of Voters," which modified the provisions for voter registration in municipal elections.

Following the passage of Resolution 25-08, the Council has received significant feedback from members of the community. To address many of the concerns expressed in that feedback, the Council has drafted a new Charter Amendment Resolution 26-TK, which would supersede Resolution 25-08. **A copy of the proposed legislation follows this announcement or can be found here:**

The New Carrollton City Council will hold two public hearings to receive resident feedback on Resolution 26-TK. All members of the New Carrollton community are invited to attend one or both of the public hearings scheduled on the dates and times listed below.
