NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held by the Council of the County of Maui, State of Hawaii, on Friday, December 1, 2023, beginning at 9:00 a.m., or soon thereafter, via BlueJeans link <https://maui.bluejeans.com/295235670>, with in person testimony and viewing available at the Council Chamber, Kalana O Maui Building, 8th Floor, 200 South High Street, Wailuku, Hawai'i, for the purpose of receiving testimony on the following:

1. Bill 104, FD1 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3.100.040, MAUI COUNTY CODE, ON USE OF THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX FUND."

This bill proposes to amend Section 3.100.040, Maui County Code, to require that recipients of County funding allow the County to audit their financial records.

2. Bill 111 (2023) entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3.100, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE AND USE TAX SURCHARGE."

This bill proposes to amend Chapter 3.100 to allocate 80 percent of all funds received from the general excise tax and use surcharge to the general excise tax fund and 20 percent to a new fund entitled "General excise tax fund - Department of Hawaiian Home Lands" and make corresponding amendments.

TESTIMONY PROCEDURES

Individuals may provide oral testimony by phone or video conference. To join the meeting by phone, call 1-408-317-9253 and input meeting code 295235670. To join by video conference, use the following link: <https://maui.bluejeans.com/295235670>.

Each testifier shall be allowed to speak for up to three minutes. If approved by the presiding officer and announced prior to any oral testimony being taken, the testifier may be allowed one minute to conclude their testimony. The time limits for testimony at a public hearing may be

modified, if the modification is initiated by the presiding officer and approved by a majority of the Council; provided that a modification would apply equally to all testifiers. No further oral testimony by the testifier shall be permitted. An individual's request to testify may be deemed withdrawn if the individual does not answer when called to testify.

If a testifier wishes to testify anonymously, please indicate that request in the Bluejeans chat or with staff at the sign-up desk outside the Council Chamber. Anonymous testifiers will be assigned a number.

DECORUM

Any person who behaves in a manner that disrupts, disturbs, or impedes the orderly conduct of the Council public hearing may, at the discretion of the presiding officer or a majority of present Councilmembers, be removed from the Council Chamber or, if participating remotely, muted or dropped from the public hearing. Disruptive behavior includes, but is not limited to: heckling, shouting, use of profanity, and threatening remarks made to any member of the Council, staff, or general public.

WRITTEN TESTIMONY

Written testimony must be received at least 24 hours prior to the public hearing. While the Council requests that written testimony be submitted as noted, testimony submitted after that date and time will still be accepted.


Councilmembers may or may not participate from Courtesy Testimony Sites. If any Courtesy Testimony Site loses its audio connection to the public hearing, the public hearing will continue without that location.

If BlueJeans connectivity affecting quorum is lost, the Council will be in recess. It will not be considered a loss of quorum unless connectivity cannot be restored within 30 minutes. If the BlueJeans connection is prematurely terminated, for whatever reason, please log back into the same link. If connectivity affecting quorum cannot be restored within 30 minutes, the public hearing will automatically reconvene the following Tuesday at 9:00 a.m., using the same virtual connections, unless the Council announces a different date and time.

If Akakū prematurely ceases broadcasting the public hearing, the public hearing will continue via interactive conference technology and a recording will be sent to Akakū to be included with archived meeting videos.
