The City Council of the City of Piedmont met in regular session at the time and on the date above. Present were Mayor Baker, Council Members John Lawrence, Richard Williams, Jubal Feazell, Caleb Pope, Greg South, David Ivey, and Terry Kiser.

Following the invocation by Jubal Feazell and the pledge of allegiance given by Mayor Baker, the minutes were presented for consideration. Terry Kiser made the motion that the minutes be approved as presented. Richard Williams seconded the motion and the minutes were approved.

The bills totaling \$977,507.65 were then presented for consideration for payment. Richard Williams made the motion that the bills be approved as presented. David Ivey seconded the motion and the bills were approved to be paid as presented.

The next item on the agenda was Resolution 2025-28. Jubal Feazell made the motion to approve Resolution 2025-28. Terry Kiser seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The purchase of a new automated garbage truck was the next item on the agenda. Caleb Pope made the motion to approve the purchase of a new Freightliner M2-106 Plus for the amount of \$307,310.00 on a two year lease with a buy back from Ingram Equipment. Richard Williams seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The purchase of electrical supplies from Gresco was the next item on the agenda. Richard Williams made the motion to approve the purchase of electrical materials in the amount of \$26,382.85. David Ivey seconded the motion and the motion carried.

After the Police and Fire reports, there were no visitor comments.

In Council reports, John Lawrence had no report.

Richard Williams told that Fagan's Park was looking good with the new café open, new pickle ball courts, and new basketball goals.

Jubal Feazell told everyone about the grand opening of the Depot Museum on September 28 from 1 – 4 pm.

Caleb Pope had no report.

Greg South had no report.

David Ivey said he was working with Ben on the electronic work orders.

Terry Kiser had no report.

Clerk Hinton announced that NK's Café had a great turnout on their grand opening. He informed the Council that the new basketball goals have been installed. In closing, he told everyone to remember the run-off election for District 1 on Tuesday, September 23.

In the Mayor's comments, he wanted to let everyone know that he attended the grand opening of NK'S Café and there was a great turnout. He told everyone that the new basketball goals had been installed at Fagan's Park. Jeff has ordered new backboard brackets for the goals to sturdy them up. They plan to stripe the basketball courts next week. He also mentioned the new benches being installed at the pickle ball courts. He told Council that City crews have started repairing the wall at Millie Bramblett's house. He told everyone not to forget the run-off election for District 1 on September 23, 2025.
