SUBJECT: ADOPT A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF POMONA HOUSING AUTHORITY TO INCREASE REVENUE ESTIMATES AND APPROPRIATIONS FOR HUD HOUSING CHOICE PROGRAMS

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council, sitting as the Governing Board for the City of Pomona Housing Authority, take the following actions:

- 1) Adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-53 – A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF POMONA, CALIFORNIA, SITTING AS THE GOVERNING BOARD FOR THE POMONA HOUSING AUTHORITY (PHA) AMENDING THE FY 2025-26 OPERATING BUDGET TO INCREASE REVENUE ESTIMATES BY \$1,882,540 AND APPROPRIATIONS BY \$844,805 FROM U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HUD) FUNDS

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Pomona Housing Authority (PHA) requires updated revenue estimates and appropriations for its funding sources—Housing Choice Voucher (HCV), Mainstream Five Voucher (MS), and Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) programs—as it continues to assist more families in need. These updates are essential for fully executing the programs by the end of the fiscal year.

DISCUSSION:

The Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program provides rental assistance to eligible families in accordance with regulations established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). As the federal government’s primary program for assisting very low-income families, the elderly, and individuals with disabilities, the HCV Program enables participants to secure decent, safe, and sanitary housing within the private market. The program also affords families the flexibility to select housing that meets established program requirements. To ensure alignment with anticipated HUD funding levels, the HCV budget must be adjusted to reflect corresponding appropriations across applicable line items through June 30, 2026.

The Mainstream (MS) Program provides funding to housing agencies to support non-elderly individuals with disabilities who are transitioning from institutional settings, at risk of institutionalization, or experiencing homelessness. Administered in accordance with Housing Choice Voucher Program requirements (24 CFR Section 982), the MS Program delivers essential rental assistance and supportive services aimed at reducing and ultimately ending homelessness among this population. To maintain consistency with projected HUD revenue, the MS budget must

likewise be adjusted to reflect appropriate allocations across relevant line items through June 30, 2026.

Eligibility for the Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) Program is limited to individuals and families who are (1) experiencing homelessness, (2) at risk of homelessness, (3) fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking, or (4) recently homeless, where rental assistance will prevent a return to homelessness or housing instability.

The City of Pomona has experienced an unanticipated increase in EHV port-in activity as participants relocate into the jurisdiction and transfer their vouchers. To effectively accommodate this growth, it is necessary to increase both revenue projections and corresponding appropriations for EHV port-in participants to ensure sufficient budget capacity through June 30, 2026.

COUNCIL PRIORITIES & GOALS:

This item supports City Council Goal K – to reduce the unsheltered homeless population by 10% annually and take actions to mitigate the impacts of homelessness on the community.
