

The Diamondville Town Council met in regular session on Monday, June 17th, at 6:00 p.m. in the Town Hall, pursuant to due notice and call.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00p.m.

Upon roll call the following were found to be present constituting a quorum: Mayor Clint Bowen, Council Members, Eric Backman, Rob Sawaya, Sherrol Sloan, Nicole Peterson, Chief of Police Jeff Kolata and Clerk Treasurer Cortney Bartschi

Reading of the Minutes:

Council Sawaya motioned to approve the minutes from June 3rd regular session meeting, seconded by Council Peterson, all voted aye, motion carried.

Approval of the Agenda:
