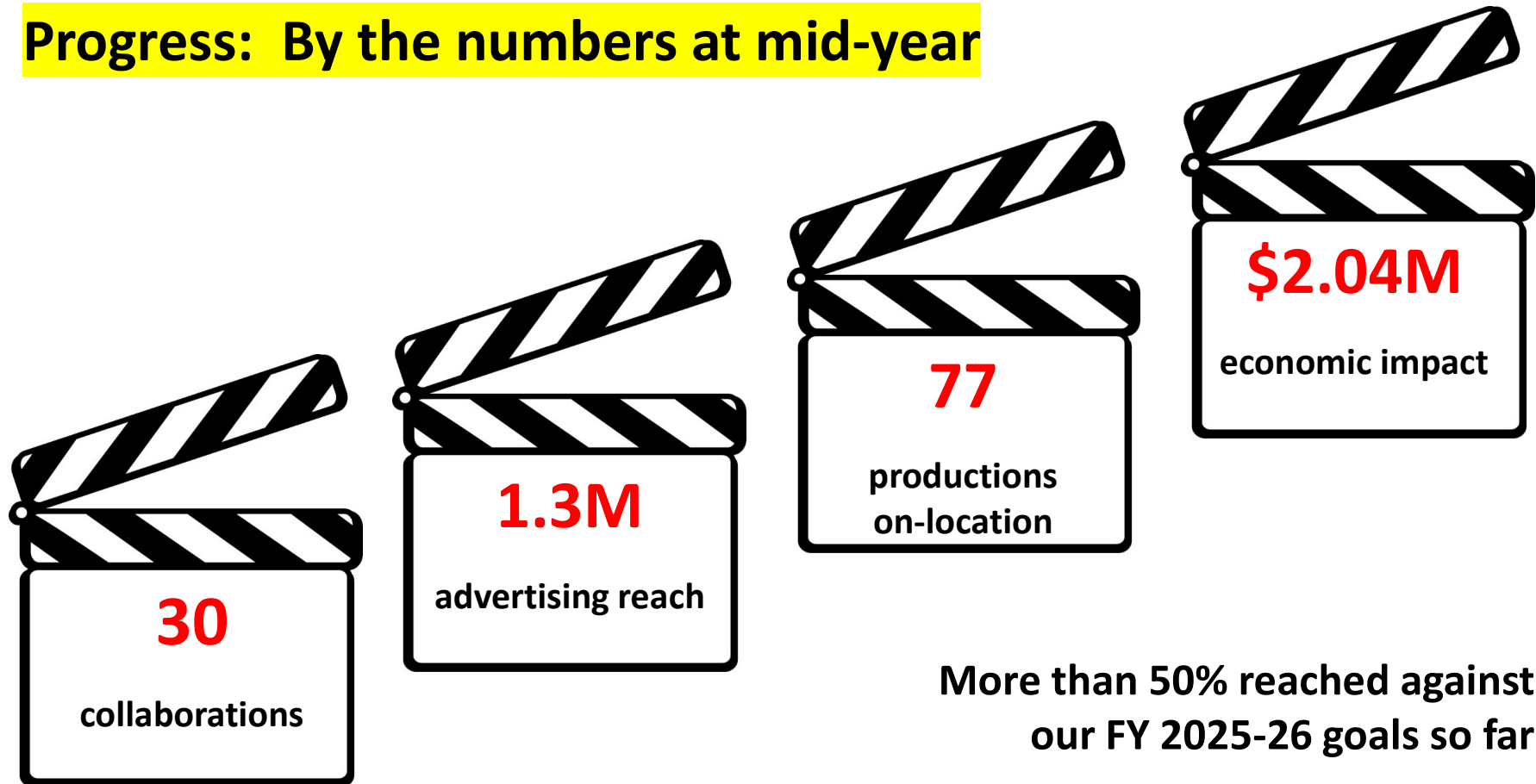

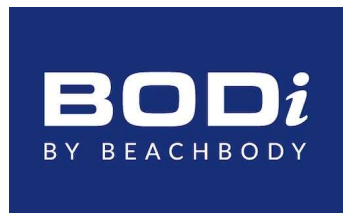

CA Film Incentive Program 4.0: Doubled to \$750 million

The California legislature approved a \$750M film and TV tax incentive program effective July 1, 2025. Tax credits will now be refundable.

Productions that film outside the LA Zone (like Monterey County) get an additional 5% boost.

Since its inception in 2009, California's Film & Television Tax Credit Program, administered by the California Film Commission, has generated over **\$30.6 billion in economic activity** and has supported **more than 228,000 cast and crew jobs** across the state.

Local exposure: Filming's financial impact in Monterey County

Boosting the economy through film and media productions

The nonprofit Monterey County Film Commission (MCFC) has been effectively promoting Monterey County as a premier film site to the film industry since it was established by the Monterey County Board of Supervisors in 1987. To date, more than \$142 million has come to county-wide communities from direct location spend by productions such as the recent "Whalefall" feature film, TV series "Big Little Lies," commercials, videos, documentaries, and fashion shoots.

The film commission's website showcases film locations, permit details, Made-in-Monterey movie information, and maintains an online Production Resources Guide. Monterey County residents and businesses interested in being hired by on-location productions can list their contact information for free at <https://FilmMonterey.org/Resources/>. MCFC is helping build and strengthen the local crew base with "Hollywood in Your Backyard" networking events, connecting with filmmakers and supporters of film. And to help future filmmakers, MCFC seeks private donations to fund its annual Director Emeritus Richard Tyler Film Student Scholarship Award for Monterey County film students. 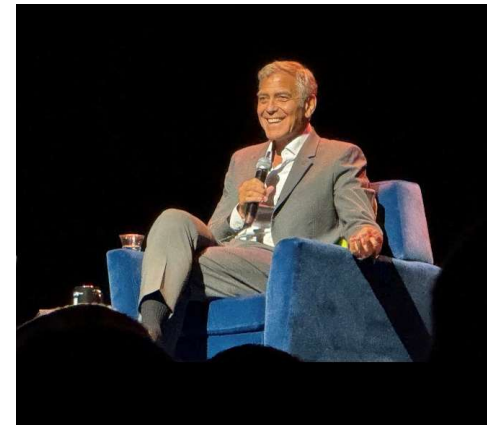

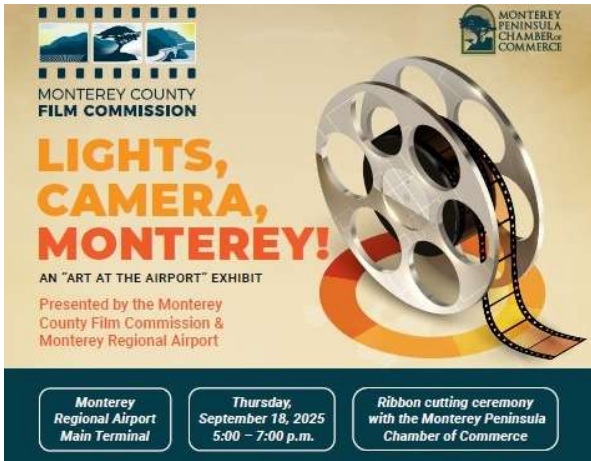
