1. Call Meeting to Order
Meeting called to order at 8:30 a.m. by Alicia Stascak.
2. Statement of County Mission and Vision
Stascak read the Mission and Visions Statements.
3. Approval of Agenda
Motion to approve the Agenda made by Nancy Getzloff and seconded by Amy Longsine. The motion was voted on and carried.
4. Approval of minutes from 2-10-2025 meeting
Motion to approve the minutes from the 8-12-2025 meeting made by Nancy Getzloff and seconded by Teresa Esela. The motion was voted on and carried.
5. Oconto County CLTS Enrollment/Waitlist
Teresa Esela reported that there are 162 youth enrolled in CLTS. There are 5 youth on the waiting list, 3 of which are pending functional screens. In comparison, in March of 2025 there were 138 youth enrolled, and 19 youth on the waiting list. Esela also reported there are 4 youth who have or will be aging out of the program; 1 aged out in April, and is waiting to be enrolled into adult services, 2 will in June, and 1 will in July.
6. Statewide CLTS Enrollment/Waitlist
Esela reported that Statewide, there are 30,289 youth enrolled in CLTS and an additional 907 youth on the waiting list. In comparison, in March of 2025 there were 26,326 youth enrolled statewide, and 1,118 youth on the waiting list statewide.
7. CST update
Getzloff reported that as of today there are 10 youth enrolled in CST. Since the last meeting, there has been 1 client who successfully discharged from the program and 3 new referrals noting that there are 6 dual CCS/CLTS enrollments that are pending functional screens.
8. Discussion Summer Program at New View Industries
Will Kline, Vocational Services Manager updated the committee on the youth summer program at New View Industries. This year there are 21 youth participating in the program which is roughly 13% of youth enrolled in the CLTS program. There are 14 staff hired on this year, several are returning from last year, and there are a few staff who have been returning for the past 3 or 4 years now. Some themed activities the youth will be enjoying this year include; camping, fishing, celebrating 250 years of independence in the United States on the 4th of July, cooking classes, botanical gardens, and working with elders in the community. Discussion followed. Longsine reported on initiatives Public Health has that may be a good fit for a future summer program including; bike rodeo, safety town, and maintaining good personal hygiene.
9. Any other Business

- Esela led a discussion regarding Wisconsin County Human Service Association (WCHSA) and their proposal for CCOP allocations and CLTS Maintenance of Effort (MOE). They are proposing to eliminate the annual MOE, for all counties who have a MOE, using CCOP funds and then redistributing CCOP funds based on a formula. Their proposal will be sent to the Bureau of Children Services. Final plans have not been provided as of yet, but Esela reports that there will not be a negative impact to Oconto County.
- Deviley reported an uptick in families requiring additional support during the spring months. Discussion followed regarding springtime often being a busier season for youth in crisis and increased mental health concerns. The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) was also discussed. NAMI is one of the nation's largest mental health organizations. North Bay NAMI, formed in 2026, serves families in Oconto and Marinette Counties and offers programs and resources to help the community better understand and navigate mental health challenges. The committee expressed interest in having Sara provide a presentation to both the committee and the agency as a whole regarding NAMI.
