The City Council of the City of Piedmont met in regular session at the time and on the date above. Present were Mayor Baker, Council Members John Lawrence, Richard Williams, Jubal Feazell, Caleb Pope, Greg South, David Ivey, and Terry Kiser.

Following the invocation by David Ivey and the pledge of allegiance given by Mayor Baker, the minutes were presented for consideration. Terry Kiser made the motion that the minutes be approved as presented. John Lawrence seconded the motion and the minutes were approved. Jubal Feazell abstained.

The bills totaling \$621,589.35 were then presented for consideration for payment. Richard Williams made the motion that the bills be approved as presented. David Ivey seconded the motion and the bills were approved to be paid as presented.

The next item on the agenda was the de-annexation of 667 Wagon Road. Terry Kiser made the motion to table this to a later date. Caleb Pope seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The Mayor read a resignation letter from Brea Ingram of the Commercial Development Board.

Chief Todd Kirkland told the Council that he had been approved for a grant from Coosa Valley in the amount of \$13,934.52. He asked the Council to approve spending the grant money for classroom furniture and computers. Terry Kiser made the motion to allow the Fire Chief to use the grant money to purchase class room furniture and computers. Richard Williams seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Chief Nathan Johnson addressed the Council with an overtime grant that had been applied for and approved from ADECA. The grant will give the police a \$2500.00 grant to cover up to that amount of overtime for the officers that would be working. Jubal Feazell made the motion to allow Chief Johnson to accept the grant and use for overtime purposes. Richard Williams seconded the motion and the motion carried.

There were no visitor comments.

Jubal Feazell asked if the decorative stop signs for the four way stop at the gazebo had been ordered. He asked if pictures could be sent of the stop signs.

In the Mayor's comments, he read a Farm City proclamation to everyone. He told of negative comments on Facebook concerning Resolution 2025-25 which was a cash match of \$115,000 for a \$1,000,000.00 grant. He said that would be a great investment to secure a grant of that magnitude.

With no other business to come before the Council, Caleb Pope made the motion that the meeting be adjourned. Greg South seconded the motion and the meeting adjourned at 5:56 pm.
