- G. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS:
 1. **CONTINUED FROM THE APRIL 9, 2026, REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING: CONTRACT – TOWN ENGINEER CONTRACT, LLOYD CONSULTING GROUP, LLC:** Mayor and Council will consider and may take action to award a five-year contract (C2026-07) for Town Engineering services to Lloyd Consulting Group, LLC dba Lloyd Sports + Engineering to provide ongoing engineering related services to the Town for a five-year term commencing on April 10, 2026, and terminating on April 9, 2031. This is one of four contract recommendations for engineering services and is the result of a Request for Qualifications process. Engineering services funds are annually adopted in the Town Budget's Highway User Revenue Fund (HURF), the General Fund Community Development Department and Capital Projects. If approved, this is the first contract with Lloyd Consulting Group, LLC. Council may provide direction to the Town Manager.

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2. CONTINUED FROM THE APRIL 9, 2026, REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING: CONTRACT – TOWN ENGINEER CONTRACT, RICK, COLLAR & WAGONER ENGINEERING, INC: Mayor and Council will consider and may take action to award a five-year contract (C2026-08) for Town Engineering services to Rick, Collar & Wagoner Engineering, Inc., dba RICK Engineering to provide ongoing engineering related services to the Town for a five-year term commencing on April 10, 2026, and terminating on April 9, 2031. This is one of four contract recommendations for engineering services and is the result of a Request for Qualifications process. Engineering services funds are annually adopted in the Town Budget's Highway User Revenue Fund (HURF), the General Fund Community Development Department and Capital Projects. If approved, this is the first contract with Rick, Collar & Wagoner Engineering, Inc. Council may provide direction to the Town Manager.

3. TRIBAL REVENUE SHARING SUPPORT LETTER REQUEST: Council will consider and may take action to approve support letters to be included with the Tempe Union High School District (TUHSD) revenue sharing grant application to the Fort McDowell Yavapai Nation. The grant requests \$8,000 to support the Circle of Nations Pathway Program, which would provide financial assistance to at-risk students to complete studies. Revenue sharing applications are due to the Fort McDowell Yavapai Nation on May 1, 2026. Council may provide direction to the Town Manager.

4. GUADALUPE ROAD ROADWAY AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS UPDATE: Council will receive an update on the Guadalupe Road Improvements Project. This project is estimated at \$1,713,975, which includes \$1,616,279 Highway Infrastructure Programs (HIP) Congressional Directed Spending federal aid grant and \$97,697 Town of Guadalupe FY27 Capital Project funds and is administered by the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) through the Council approved intergovernmental agreement (IGA) (C2025-15). This project includes pavement rehabilitation of approximately 0.7 miles of Guadalupe Road, between Interstate 10 (I-10) and the Town of Guadalupe east town limit at the Highline Canal and pedestrian safety improvements. Council may provide direction to the Town Manager.

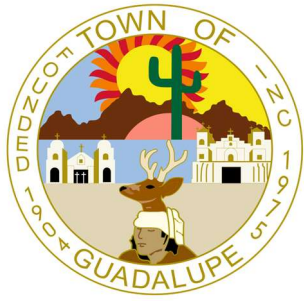

5. CONTRACT – LA CUARENTA STREETLIGHTNG DESIGN CONTRACT: SOLARES NEIGHBORHOOD STREET LIGHTING IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM PHASE 2 ENGINEERING, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION SERVICES CONTRACT: Council will consider and may take action to award contract (C2026-10), in the amount of \$34,181, to the Town Engineer, Dibble Engineering, for engineering, design and construction document preparation, construction bid process oversight, construction management, quality control and inspection services for Roadway and Neighborhood Lighting Project, Phase 3, consisting of relamping 21 street lights in the Cuarenta neighborhood and replacing/installing 14 new street lights. This contract is funded through Community Development Block Grant funding of \$423,300, through Maricopa County, as approved by the Town Council on October 9, 2025. Council may provide direction to the Town Manager.

6. CONTRACT - YOUTH TRANSIT PASS PROGRAM: Council will consider and may take action to approve an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) (C2026-11) between the City of Tempe and the Town of Guadalupe for participation in the City of Tempe's Youth Transit Pass Program. The Town's annual cost based on estimated current participant use is \$15,000. Approval of this IGA authorizes the Mayor, or designee, to sign all necessary documents in furtherance of this agreement. Council may provide direction to the Town Manager.

7. PROPOSED TENTATIVE FISCAL YEAR 2026/2027 TOWN BUDGET INTRODUCTION:
Town staff will present the proposed Tentative Fiscal Year (FY27) 2026/2027 Town Budget totaling \$12,857,173 and the Five-Year Financial Forecast for Town Council for review, consideration, and input. This is the introduction to the FY27 Annual Budget, where proposed FY27 General Fund expenditures exceed General Fund revenue collections. Additionally, the Five-Year Forecast projects expenditures to exceed revenue collections annually. Adoption of Tentative FY27 Budget and Final FY27 Budget are scheduled for May 27, 2026, and June 25, 2026, Town Council meetings, respectively. Council may provide direction to the Town Manager.
