SNAPSHOT: July - December 2025

- \$161,300 invested in 45 local arts organizations—strengthening the creative economy = \$1 million economic impact
- 227 Open Studios participants (+51% growth from 2024)
- 35 artists and 60+ original works exhibited at the County Government Center
- Prop 28 provides \$12M+ annually to Monterey County schools for arts education
- Regional shortfall of 129 credentialed arts & music teachers—pathway partnerships underway

Looking Ahead: 2026 Priorities

- • Expand credentialed arts teacher workforce pathway with regional college partners
- • Grow County-based public art exhibitions and civic installations
- • Continue mural collaborations and creative placemaking in underserved areas
- • Support cultural tourism through updated Art Tours and community festivals
- • Deepen partnerships that leverage County investment for maximum community benefit

Goal #2 - WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Visual Art and Performing Arts Pathway

- In November 2022, PROP 28 passed with an overwhelming majority and now provides \$1 billion annually to fund more than 5,500 NEW credentialed or classified art teachers to fulfill the mandated visual and performing arts programs throughout California schools, with more than \$12,000,000 funded to Monterey County K-12 schools.
- Our local region (Santa Cruz, San Benito and Monterey County) is short by **129 credentialed art and music teachers**.
- Partnering with CSUMB to develop a pathway for artists and teachers to obtain the required training.



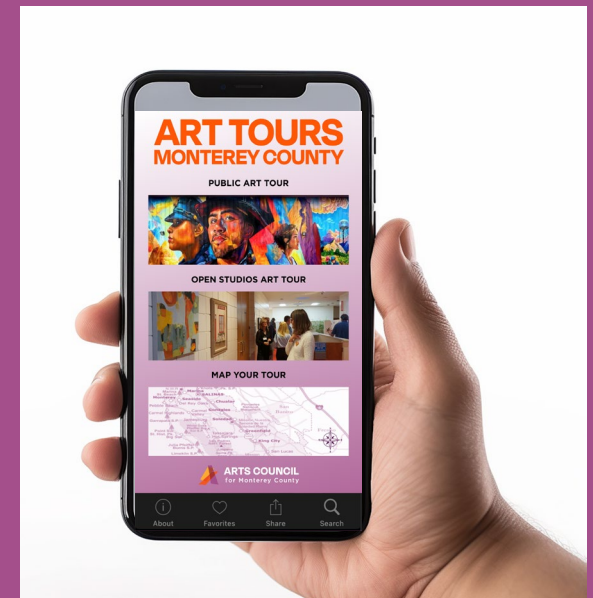

2025 Highlights



- ✓ Held October 12th & 13th and October 19th & 20th
- ✓ Increased number of participants from 150 in 2024 to 227 in 2025 - a 51% increase in 2nd year
- ✓ Artists opened their studios from Moss Landing to King City
- ✓ 12% of attendees visited from outside of Monterey County
- ✓ Updated Public Art Tour to Free Mobile App in 2025

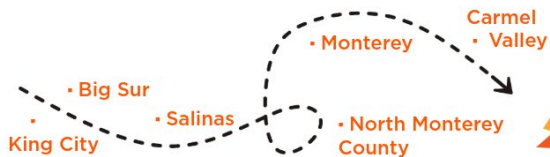

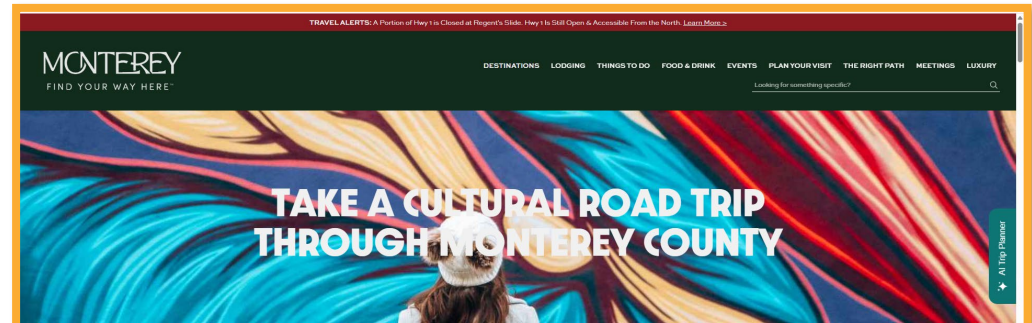

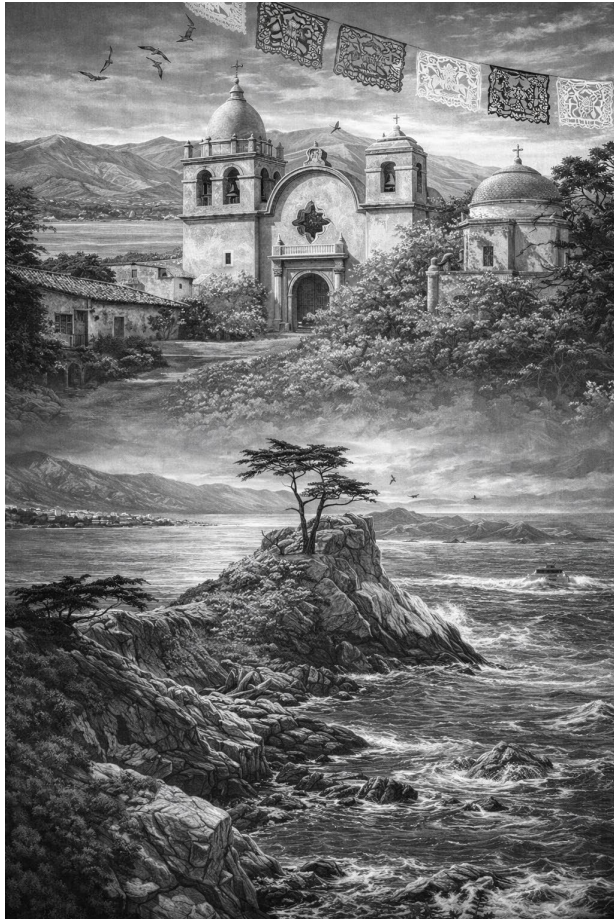
