Health In All Policies



2025 Accomplishments



- Public Health **completed over 9,900 visits with pregnant community members and families.**
- Over **4,900 vaccines were provided** to community at **95 clinics.**
- Our Fall Prevention Project helped **73 residents avoid falls and reduce lift assists.**
- Our health promotion team leveraged **over \$2.3 million** in funds for active living and physical development infrastructure.

2025 Accomplishments (continued)



- Our substance use prevention team provided **naloxone training to over 100 people.**
- Our environmental health team **distributed over 800 radon test kits.**
- Our Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) staff **provided nutrition and breastfeeding education to 8,666 community members.**
- Our Child and Teen Checkup (C&TC) staff contacted **7,854 individuals about the benefits of infant and child preventive health care.**

When ICE sweeps a community, public health pays a price – and recovery will likely take years

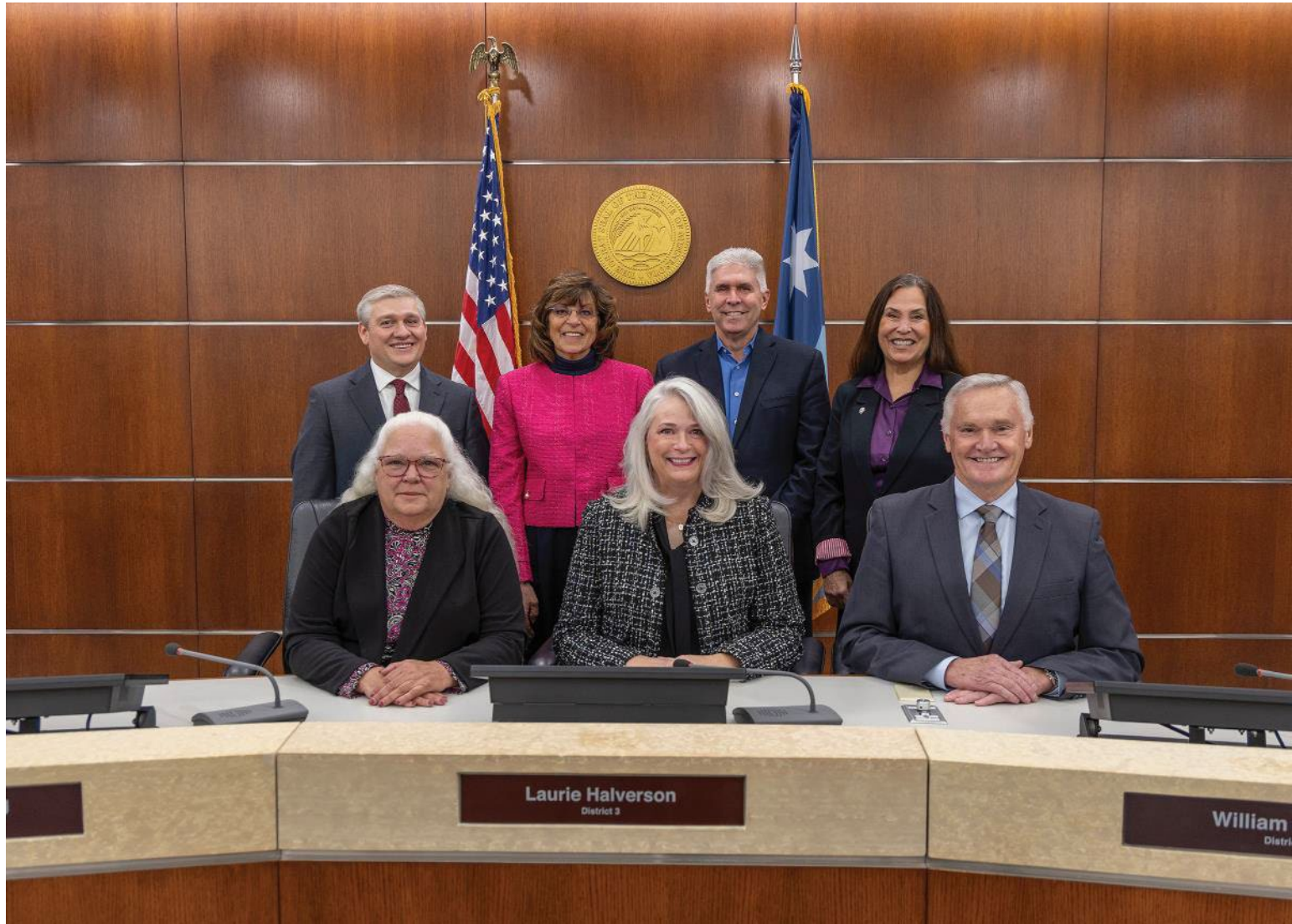
