

City of Allison Regular Council Meeting

Monday, January 26th, 2026

Regular Meeting:

Mayor Pro-Tem Bangasser opened the regular meeting of the Allison City Council at 5:15 p.m. The council members present were Bangasser, Cramer, Galey, Henning, Heuer. Absent: Mayor Junker. Also present: Trent Stirling, Coby Bangasser, Chris Graser, City Engineer Zeb Stanbrough, Joe Conlon, Lisa Cassman, and Dale Pothast. Henning made a motion to approve the agenda with a second by Cramer. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Open Forum:

Council member Galey let the council know about the paint Iowa beautiful grant. She will be putting some stuff together to provide for the City Administrator/City Clerk Alexis Wiegmann, and Deputy Utility Clerk Chris Graser to apply for the grant.

City Administrator/City Clerk, Alexis Wiegmann, asked the council their thoughts on putting an ad out for Lifeguards and a Pool Manager for the 2026 pool season. The Council agreed that this was a good idea and to start getting the help wanted ads out in the paper and online.

Council member Cramer asked why there is still snow on the sidewalks as it has been over 48 hours since the last snowfall. City Administrator/City Clerk Alexis Wiegmann let them know that Mayor Junker is going to be contacting Stirling Lawn Care to get the snow removed.

Mayor Junker provided a mayor's report and let the council know that he has a couple meetings planned for the end of this week to work on setting up a development group and to work on low income housing to get a new management group.

Consent Agenda:

New Business:

Dale Pothast came and talked to the council about a couple areas of sidewalk that need to be repaired and to see if there was anything that the council could come up with to help encourage homeowners to fix their sidewalks. Council member Bangasser let him know that there is a sidewalk plan in place where the city will reimburse up to \$500.00 to homeowners who replace their sidewalks. Along with this, the city pays for ADA's to be put in if that is part of the homeowner's sidewalk. It is the homeowner's responsibility to repair the sidewalk and there are areas throughout town where pieces of the sidewalk

have been dug up and not replaced. There will be further discussion held on sidewalks as spring gets closer so that the areas can be evaluated.

Old Business:

In regard to the siren, it was decided that there would be a poll on the back of the March water bills that will ask if homeowners would like to keep the 7/12/6 siren. There will be a yes/no option that homeowners can choose and once they come back, they will be taken to the council for consideration on how to handle the siren.

The action to discuss and approve council appointments and committees for 2026 has been postponed to the next council meeting on 02/09/2026.

Deputy Utility Clerk Chris Graser, let the council know that she will be meeting with Mayor Junker at the end of this week or beginning of next to look at water bills/shut offs.
